THEATER I



Semester

Grades: 9-12th

Prerequisite: None The essentials of acting technique for the stage, including voice, body movement, self-awareness, imagination, and concentration will be investigated. Characterizations and staging will then be expanded upon through various improvisations, scene work, and script analysis. Students will learn theater conventions, vocabulary, and theater history.

THEATER II



1 Year

Grades 10-12th

Prerequisite: Theater I Furthering the study of acting technique for the stage. Course work includes reading play scripts, play preparation, character investigations, and in class rehearsals. This course also introduces students to the art of playwriting, to deepen students understanding of their art. Students in this class perform their selected play as part of the One Acts in the fall and spring.

STAGE CRAFT I



Semester

Grades 9-12th

Prerequisite: None Stage Craft is the study of technical theatre. This course will introduce students to technical and production aspects of theatre. Students will learn skills in set construction, painting, lighting, sound, costume, props, and stage makeup. In this course students will explore areas of scenic, lighting and sound design. Students will assist in the One Acts or spring musical production.

STAGE CRAFT II

Semester

Grades 10-12th



Prerequisite: Stage Craft I Stage Craft is the study of technical theatre. This course will further the students understanding of technical and production aspects of theatre. Students will build on skills in set construction, painting, lighting, sound, costume, props, and stage makeup. In this course students will use areas of scenic, lighting and sound design. Students will assist in the One Acts or spring musical production.
